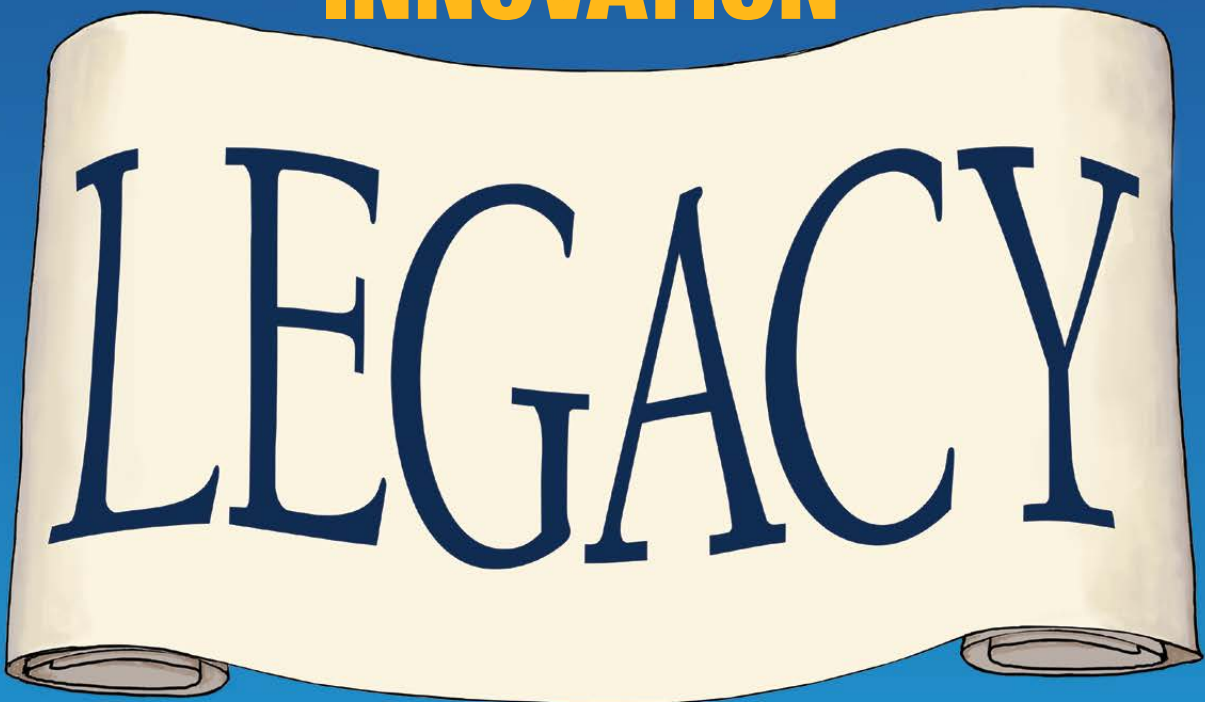

Changes in the regulations for human subjects’ research and how they may help researchers will be presented. An overview of the regulations, changes in the Common Rule, and a discussion on the procedural and substantive issues that IRB reviewers debate, that may impede nurse researchers, will be discussed.
